

INCIDENT RESPONSE REVIEW

- Updated slides from last week: 3,4,5,6,7,9,11
- This past Friday was the last day that Georgia will be reporting data on all business days. Starting this week, we can expect a report of the week's data on each Wednesday
- This will inhibit our data collection efforts to document trends, making our waste-water surveillance partnership with Emory and DPH a critical component to COVID monitoring efforts
- Hospitalizations & deaths have plateaued since the last week
- Cases and % positives have continued to rise slowly
- Current modeling has the Fulton County COVID forecasted metrics showing a BA.2 bump for the next few weeks
- BA.2 variant now accounts for 72% of all new cases while 19%

4/13/22 Fulton County Risk Level (New)



- Fulton County Cases per 100K = 55.36
- New Fulton County COVID Hospital Admissions per 100K = *3.0
- Fulton County % of staffed inpatient beds occupied by COVID-19 patients (7-day average) = 1.6%




- The BA.2 variant (pink) now accounts for 72% of all new cases in Georgia, which is more transmissible than the original Omicron
- BA.2.12.1 a new Omicron subvariant (orange) accounts for 19%
- The OMICRON variant (purple) accounts for 9%,

RA 2 is 40% more contagious than the original omicron RA 2.12 is even more contagious




Incident Response Update



- Fulton County COVID-19
 - 7-day average for cases is 61, up 77% since the last BoC mtg.
 - 7-day average for % positive is 3.4%, up 110% since the last BoC mtg.
 - 7-day average, hospitalizations is 69, down 90% since the last BoC mtg.
 - 7 day average, for deaths is 2.1, down 90% since the last BoC mtg.

Fulton County Dashboard totals for 4-13-2022: Tests = 2,580 / Cases = 61 / % Positive = 1.6% / Hosp COVID19 Census = 65 / Deaths = 0





Fulton County, BoH, Ryan White Antigen Test Kits


- •We distributed 68% of the test kits
- We are maintaining 32% of the test kits for future response



Developed a new testing model with one of our 3rd party testing partners

- PCR testing kiosks
- Employee / Family Use
- Future expansion to allow all citizens access
- Kiosk will dispense a self swab test kits & a sample collection box will be co-located
- Results will be delivered in 48 to 72 hrs
- Fulton County's first three units will be in the government center, the courthouse and Rice Street

Service Updates - May 2, 2022

- On May 2, the Fulton County Sheriff's Office will implement additional security measures for Grand Jury selection for the State v. Trump.
- Street closures around the Courthouse will result in traffic impact
- Employees will be encouraged to telework where possible.



Project Overview

Since the beginning of COVID-19, the Fulton County Court System has amassed a significant and unprecedented level of cases. Project ORCA will address this challenge by utilizing a combination of capacity expansion and productivity enhancement initiatives to expedite the case adjudication process.

Case Accumulation Defined

All cases (hearings, filings, applications) that were initiated before and during the pandemic (including those currently awaiting formal charging or filing) that have been impacted due to current limitations at various stages of the case administration process.


Hiring Progress by Department




Project ORCA: Superior Court Closed Cases



Project ORCA: Superior Court Closed Cases By Judge






Project ORCA: State Court Closed Cases








Project ORCA: State Court Remaining Pending Cases By Judge


Cobb Jail ZOOM Rooms



The Jail ZOOM Rooms at Cobb County jail are now complete.

The inmates previously attended their remote hearings in a common space and both the inmates and judges complained of background noise. Going forward, the inmates will now have quiet, private rooms to attend their hearings without interruption.

The enhancement also affords the inmates and staff greater safety due to the need for reduced transportation and exposure.



Overall Progress



The Courts and Offices have continued to proceed with process and productivity enhancements making the following accomplishments:

- √ 74% of Hiring has been achieved (excluding Sheriff and Marshal positions)
- √ 3 mini-ZOOM rooms have been added at the Cobb County Jail and 26 additional ZOOM rooms are under construction at the Fulton Jail
- ✓ Superior Court work sessions are underway to devise new plans for increased efficiency and scheduling
- ✓ Daytime and Evening Bond Hearing calendars participants have been increased for expanded hearing capacity
