Dr. Doris Derby was a native of the Bronx, New York and a scholar and professor who founded Georgia State University's Office of African American Student Services and Programs; and



WHEREAS,

Dr. Derby was a painter and photographer who documented the lives of African Americans through photographs and books of poetry that told the stories of Black people to ensure that future generations will never feel unseen again; and



WHEREAS,

with a history of activism behind her, including her grandmother who was a founding member of the NAACP, Dr. Derby joined the Student Nonviolent

Coordinating Committee (SNCC), co-creating its Free Southern Theater, and worked with freedom fighters like Ambassador Andrew Young and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.; and



WHEREAS,

Dr. Derby was invited to Jackson, Mississippi in 1963

to develop a literacy program at Tougaloo College to prepare Black people to vote; she was also a friend and supporter of the ArtsXchange and was the 2021 Change Maker honoree at the Ebon Dooley Arts &

Social Justice Awards; and



WHEREAS,

Dr. Derby and her husband, Bob Banks, made Atlanta

their home and remained active in the arts and culture



scene that was one of her life's passions;
