The Martin Luther King Jr. International Chapel at Morehouse College, also known as the King Chapel, was built in 1978 and is the world's most prominent religious memorial to Morehouse alumnus and Atlanta native, The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. '48; and

WHEREAS,



King Chapel is home base for spiritual servants, scholars, and thought leaders who are furthering the work of peace and justice in the tradition of Dr. King, Howard Washington Thurman '23, Benjamin Elijah Mays, and others who have used the Gospel to manifest Christ's teachings; and



WHEREAS,

King Chapel serves as a center for the perpetuation of the evolutionary values of cosmopolitan spiritual ethics, nonviolence, service, and harmony in everyday life; and



WHEREAS,

the Chapel's rededication is a two-day series of commemorative programs that includes a symposium of sessions led by distinguished Morehouse College professors and scholars, and special guests including Ambassador Andrew J. Young and The Rev. Al Sharpton Jr.; and



WHEREAS,

the Chapel's rededication follows an \$11 million renovation of the historic building with the theme, Saving Democracy While Thriving in the Wake of Cosmic Trauma; and
