WHEREAS, Pancreatic cancer has the highest mortality rate of all major cancers and is the 3rd leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the United States after lung and colon, and without an early detection it is expected to become the 2nd leading cause of

cancer-related deaths in the U.S. by 2030; and

ULTON DUNTY WHEREAS

WHEREAS, in 2023 an estimated 64,050 Americans will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the U.S., and over 50,550 will die from pancreatic cancer; this marks a 6 percent and 5 percent increase

respectively, and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is one of the few cancers for which the

survival rate has not improved substantially over nearly 40 years; the combined five-year survival rate for pancreatic cancer

is very low at just 5 - 10 percent; and

WHEREAS, stage IV pancreatic cancer has a five-year survival rate of just 1

percent; pancreatic cancer has the highest mortality rate of all major cancers with 80% of all patients dying within the first

year of diagnosis; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is a leading cause of cancer death largely

because there are no early detection tools to diagnose the disease in its early stages when surgical removal of the tumor is

still possible;
