Incident Response Management Team Update



Fulton County COVID-19 cases

- Since 7/24/20, 7-day avg. for cases has dropped from a high of 400 to 87
- Since 7/12/20, 7-day avg. for % positive tests has dropped from a high of 16% to 5.1 %
- Fulton County currently has 8.90 % of Georgia's case load

COVID-19 Deaths

- Lagging indicator, that has dropped from a high on 8/8/20 of 7.6 a day to
 1.43
- Fulton County currently has 8.74 % of Georgia's death toll

COVID-19 Fulton County Hospitalizations


- Since 7/23/20, 7-day avg. for COVID-19 Hospitalizations has dropped from 600 to 221
- Since 7/17/20, Fulton County has added 266 Staffed General beds & 23
 Staffed CCU beds

- Testing results are now available in < 48 hrs

























9-14-2020 Fulton County as a % of Georgia Totals over time













C#VID-19

- Testing demand at SPOCs has decreased over past weeks. Logistics continue to be optimal
 with results turnaround time now usually 1-2 days and same day appointments available.
- Surge SPOC at the Atlanta Airport terminated on September 11.
- FCBOH still investigating multiple COVID-19 clusters associated with return to schools and universities. Joint call with Metro Health Directors, Commissioner Toomey and Superintendents on September 16.
- MOUs with City of Atlanta, Partners in Health, CORE signed. Scope of covered activities
 is: 1) COVID testing 2) Case and Contact Investigation 3) Resource Coordination of social
 services to allow cases and contacts to maintain quarantine.
- Several Campaigns launching:
 - Seasonal influenza vaccination
 - Mask-On
 - Initiative at SPOCs to facilitate contact tracing






