A RESOLUTION CREATING AND ESTABLISHING THE FULTON COUNTY VETERANS EMPOWERMENT COMMISSION, INC., A DOMESTIC NON PROFIT ENTITY; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE COUNTY MANAGER AND COUNTY ATTORNEY TO TAKE ALL NECESSARY STEPS TO FORM AND IMPLEMENT THIS ENTITY CONSISTENT WITH THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF GEORGIA; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

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WHEREAS, the brave men and women serving in the United States' Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard demonstrate a resolute spirit and unmatched selflessness in the performance of a civic duty that is beneficial to all citizens of the United States; and

WHEREAS, according to U.S. Census Bureau statistics, as of July 1, 2019, Fulton County, Georgia was estimated to be home to approximately 50,000 United States military veterans; and

WHEREAS, an American Community Survey Report published by the U.S. Census Bureau in June 2020 found, among other things, that military veterans are more likely to suffer from trauma-related injuries, substance abuse, and mental health disorders than people who have never served in the armed forces. Moreover, post-9/11 veterans had a 43 percent chance of having a service-connected disability while the percentage of female veterans is increasing; and

WHEREAS, according to the United States Department of Veterans Affairs, U.S. service members returning to civilian life have difficulty reconnecting with family and re-establishing a role in the family; joining or creating a community; preparing to enter to the civilian workforce or returning to a civilian job; creating structure; providing food, clothing and housing for themselves; reestablishing services such as medical, dental, insurance, or other service

- benefits; and are at greater risk for suicide and homelessness than those who
- 2 have not served in the U.S. military; and
- 3 **WHEREAS**, the Fulton County Board of Commissioners believes it will
- 4 benefit all citizens of Fulton County to assist the veteran population residing in
- 5 Fulton County with their transition to civilian life and dealing with the unique
- 6 challenges facing the veteran population through the formation of veterans
- 7 organization that will focus on the wellbeing of veterans residing in Fulton
- 8 County, Georgia.
- 9 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of
- 10 Commissioners of Fulton County hereby creates and establishes the Fulton
- 11 County Veterans Empowerment Commission, Inc., a domestic nonprofit entity
- 12 (the "Veterans Commission"), effective upon its formation and recognition as a
- legal entity under the laws of the State of Georgia.
- 14 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the County Manager, with the
- assistance of the County Attorney, are hereby authorized and directed to take all
- 16 necessary steps to form and implement the Veterans Commission consistent
- with the laws of the State of Georgia.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Veterans Commission shall,
- among other things, function to empower veterans to improve their health and
- 20 wellbeing, and provide information and resources to veterans and their families
- 21 on available benefits, medical care, social support and financial opportunities.
- 22 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Veterans Commission shall serve
- 23 as an advisory body to the Board of Commissioners to investigate and provide

recommendations to the Board of Commissioners of priorities, objectives, and policies which will support the veteran population in Fulton County and to research and apply for grant funding and to otherwise make funding recommendations for public and private programs which will benefit the veteran population of Fulton County, Georgia.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Veterans Commission shall have the following members: Each Commissioner shall appoint two (2) members. Such appointees shall be residents of, or work in, Fulton County and shall have military experience or expertise in the areas affecting military veterans.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that appointees to the Veterans Commission shall serve three (3) year terms, with such term subject to the discretion of the appointing Commissioner, who can remove a member for cause, otherwise such members may continue to serve beyond his/her term until a successor is appointed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Attorney's Office or its designee is hereby authorized to be the sole legal advisor to the Veterans Commission, until it is fully operational, and this office or a designee shall prepare and file the Veterans Commission's formation documents including articles of incorporation, bylaws, and other necessary documents for this body, to ensure that the Veterans Commission is aligned with the goals and purposes as outlined in this enabling resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that members of the Veterans Commission who are affiliated with organizations that receive funding either directly or as a

1	sub-recipient of any grant administered by Fulton County or any related agency	
2	that deals with veterans matters as outlined in this resolution must recuse	
3	themselves from discussions and voting on any recommendations pertaining to	
4	the allocation or award of funding for veterans related projects or programs	
5	controlled by Fulton County. This restriction will not apply to lobbying efforts for	
6	veterans funding on the state or federal levels.	
7	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that monetary compensation will not be	
8	provided to appointed members or other volunteers for participation on the	
9	Veterans Commission.	
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Manager or his/he	
11	designee will provide meeting space and accommodations for the Veterans	
12	Commission, until it is fully operational, and the Veterans Commission sha	
13	report on the findings and proceedings of its meetings to the Board of	
14	Commissioners after each meeting and annually through the Clerk to the	
15	Commission.	
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall become effective	
17	upon its adoption, and that all resolutions and parts of resolutions in conflict with	
18	this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.
