- Many IT jobs require a bachelor's degree; however, more and more companies are finding value in hiring skilled IT employees with industry certifications.
- Multiple certifications and specific technical experience go a long way toward becoming an attractive hiring candidate.

A Day in the Life

Computer Network Support Specialists analyze, test, troubleshoot, and evaluate existing network systems, such as local area networks (LAN), wide area networks (WAN), cloud networks, servers, and other data communications networks. They perform network maintenance to ensure networks operate correctly with minimal interruption. They create electronic data backup to prevent loss of information. They implement security measures for computer or information systems. They analyze security of systems, network, or data. Resolve computer network problems. They document network-related activities or tasks and configure computer networks. Specialists install computer software and test computer system operations to ensure proper functioning. They analyze data to identify or resolve operational problems. They monitor the performance of computer networks. They provide technical support for computer network issues and troubleshoot issues with computer applications or systems. They maintain and install computer hardware. They test computer hardware performance.

How do I get into this top job?

You need an Associate's Degree to do this job. You might need additional licensing as well. Training programs and tests may be expensive, but you might not have to pay for all of it yourself. If you are low income, ask your job coach, career counselor, training program, or workforce development specialist about assisting you with your training expenses. It might be free!
