Major Take Away

Boosters are the most effective way to defend against COVID-19 severe health impacts and death


Unvaccinated population makes up...

- 49% of all new cases
- 91% of all new hospitalizations
- 93% of all new deaths

- The 7-day average for cases, hospitalizations, % positives and deaths are trending downward
- Updated CDC Masking Guidance has Fulton County in a green (low risk) level.
- 87.6% of all new cases are from the OMICRON variant
- Closely monitoring the prevalence of BA.2 variant
- So far in March 59 additional Covid Deaths
- Fulton County Covid hospital bed availability continues to be in a shortage situation, (mostly due to non-COVID admissions)

3/9/22 Fulton County Risk Level (New)



- Fulton County Cases per 100K = 39.38
- New Fulton County COVID Hospital Admissions per 100K = *3.90
- Fulton County % of staffed inpatient beds occupied by COVID-19 patients (7-day average) = 2.77%



Omicron now accounts for 87.6% of all new cases in Georgia

Lineage BA.1.1 is aggregated with B.1.1.529 at the regional level as it currently cannot be reliably called in each region.

- The BA.2 variant 12.4%, which is more transmissible than the original Omicron
- BA.2 reasons for growth: opening of society, more indoors events without masks, waning 6
 immunity from vaccination or prior infection



Breakthrough Cases Fulton County (last 14 Days) 3/9/22




Fig. 32. Confirmed Cases Hospitalized for Any Reason by Vaccination Status






Fig. 33. Confirmed Covid-19 Deaths by Vaccination Status





- Fulton County COVID-19
 - o 7-day average for cases is 35, down 182% since the last BoC mtg.
 - 7-day average for % positive is 1.6%, down 133% since the last BoC mtg.
 - o 7-day average, hospitalizations is 131, down 95% since the last BoC mtg.
 - 7 day average, for deaths is 4.0, down 72% since the last BoC mtg.



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

Case Accumulation Defined




Hiring Progress by Department



Project ORCA: Superior Court Closed Cases By Judge






Project ORCA: State Court Closed Cases









Project ORCA: State Court Remaining Pending Cases By Judge




Pilot Goal

Overall Progress





- √77% of Hiring has been achieved (excluding Sheriff and Marshal positions)
