RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING FULTON COUNTY, GEORGIA TO 1 2 RELINQUISH ITS STATUS AS AN ENTITLEMENT COMMUNITY AS DEFINED BY THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND URBAN 3 DEVELOPMENT FOR THE FOLLOWING FEDERAL GRANTS: COMMUNITY 4 5 DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT, EMERGENCY SOLUTIONS GRANT, HOME INVESTMENT **PARTNERSHIP GRANT** AND THE **NEIGHBORHOOD** 6 STABILIZATION PROGRAM GRANT; DIRECTING COUNTY STAFF TO TAKE 7 NECESSARY STEPS TO END FULTON COUNTY'S PARTICIPATION IN 8 THESE GRANT PROGRAMS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES. 9

WHEREAS, the Department of Housing and Urban Development ("HUD") has designated Fulton County as an "Entitlement Community" and annual administrator of the Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG") program, pursuant to Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, 42 U.S.C. §5301 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Title I of the Housing and Community
Development Act of 1974, counties with populations of at least 200,000,
excluding the population of "entitled cities," are qualified as Entitlement
Communities [Counties]; and

WHEREAS, as an Entitlement Community, Fulton County also receives the following federal grants directly from HUD: CDBG, Emergency Solutions Grant ("ESG"), HOME Investment Partnership Grant ("HOME"), and the Neighborhood Stabilization Program Grant ("NSP"); and

WHEREAS, County staff has estimated that approximately eighty-five percent (85%) of the grant funds allocated by HUD within Fulton County are directly allocated to cities that have been designated as Entitlement Communities separate and apart from the County's designation; and

WHEREAS, the cities of Atlanta, Johns Creek, Roswell, and Sandy
Springs have been designated Entitlement Communities [Cities] and receive
CDBG allocations directly from HUD; and

WHEREAS, the remaining approximately fifteen percent (15%) of HUD grant allocations are administered to Non-Entitlement Communities [Cities] by Fulton County pursuant to allocations provided through cooperative agreements, which outline the amount of grant funds to be used and services that will be performed with the use of the funds; and

WHEREAS, through cooperative agreements, Fulton County administers federal grant funding to the cities of Alpharetta, Chattahoochee Hills, College Park, East Point, Fairburn, Hapeville, Milton, Mountain Park, Palmetto, and Union City; and

WHEREAS, in serving the aforementioned cities through the allocation of these federal grants, Fulton County has faced challenges in meeting HUD requirements that may not always align nor fit within the real-world and real-time scenarios faced by the cities in responding to the needs of their citizenry; and

WHEREAS, Fulton County believes it would be in the best interest of the Non-Entitlement Cities that their leadership have a more direct role in applying for and managing the grants in a manner that would benefit their cities and the particular needs of their citizens; and

WHEREAS, to start the process that will result in the Non-Entitlement

Cities playing a more direct role with these federal grants, the Board of

- 1 Commissioners finds it necessary to relinquish its status as an Entitlement
- 2 Community and as the annual administrator of the federal grants; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Fulton County believes the cities will be best served by
- 4 directly engaging or partnering with the Georgia Department of Community
- 5 Affairs ("DCA") to apply for and administer these grants on their behalf; and
- 6 WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners supports the prompt and
- 7 efficient delivery of services to the citizens of Fulton County and finds that these
- 8 goals will be achieved by relinquishing its status as a HUD-designated
- 9 Entitlement Community, to no longer administer HUD federal grants, and to no
- 10 longer submit the five-year Consolidated Plan and Annual Action Plans to receive
- an annual allocation for HUD grant program funds; and
- WHEREAS, Fulton County Code of Laws ("FCC") § 1-117 gives the Board
- of Commissioners exclusive authority over the affairs of the County.
- 14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of
- 15 Commissioners of Fulton County hereby formally relinquishes its status as an
- 16 Entitlement Community as administrator of the following federal grants:
- 17 Community Development Block Grant ("CDBG"), Emergency Solutions Grant
- 18 ("ESG"), HOME Investment Partnership Grant ("HOME"), and the Neighborhood
- 19 Stabilization Program Grant ("NSP").
- 20 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Board of Commissioners directs
- 21 County staff to take any and all necessary steps to finalize this directive with the
- 22 Department of Housing and Urban Development and with the Non-Entitlement
- 23 Cities served by Fulton County under these grants. The Chairman is further

1	authorized to sign any documents related to this directive that may require the
2	signature of the official authorized to sign on behalf of Fulton County.
3	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Board of Commissioners fully supports
4	and encourages the Non-Entitlement Cities located within Fulton County to apply
5	for these federal grants through the Georgia Department of Community Affairs
6	until such time that they may also qualify as Entitlement Cities.
7	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall become effective
8	upon its adoption, and that all resolutions and parts of resolutions in conflict with
9	this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.
