WHEREAS, DeQuantes Devontay Lamar, professionally known as Rich Homie Quan, was born on October 4, 1989 in Atlanta, Georgia and became a popular music artist at 23 years old; and



WHEREAS, Quan originally had dreams of becoming a professional baseball player, but could not ignore his passion for music; his early string of hits resulted in the 2008 smash hit, *Stay Down*, which became a hood favorite and solidified the start of a promising rap career; and



WHEREAS, Quan met his label mate, Mafio, who shared his determination, and formed a group called *No Sleep Gang*, which paid homage to their all-night work habits and countless hours creating music; and



WHEREAS, Quan earned multiple gold and platinum certifications, tallied billions of streams, and proudly represented his hometown worldwide; in 2012, Quan signed with *Think It's a Game Records* and released the classic mixtape *Still Goin' In*, which is celebrating more than ten years of chart topping and streaming success; and



WHEREAS, Quan's 2018 full-length debut, *Rich As In Spirit*, bowed in the Top 20 of the Billboard Top R&B/Hip-Hop Albums Chart, and his 2022 project, *Family & Mula*, arrived on his birthday, October 4th. Revolt Summit, one of the nation's leading immersive experiences, featured Quan as the summit's closing performance which changed his career's trajectory; and




WHEREAS, Quan was the proud father of five children, and he was presented with the Netflix "Strong Black Dad" Award;
