there is a need for public education, awareness, discourse, WHEREAS, and policies that are culturally competent when describing,

discussing, or addressing the impacts of being Muslim

the General Assembly of Georgia has implemented House Bill 360 relating to holidays and observances of Muslim Americans in Georgia, and has designated the month of July in each year as Muslim American Heritage Month in

the State of Georgia;
