after working at Bennett College in North Carolina, Bunnie relocated to Atlanta, Georgia in 1965 and built a public relations and marketing firm where she served as President and CEO; she also managed soul music artists and worked with local civic organizations for nearly 60 years; and

Bunnie became the first Black First Lady of the City of Atlanta in 1973 when she was married to Mayor Maynard Jackson, during which time she boosted the arts scene in Atlanta while maintaining a family life at home; and

Bunnie was a member and leader in several social and cultural organizations, including The Links, Jack & Jill, the National Coalition of 100 Black Women, and Delta Sigma

Bunnie's greatest accomplishment was her family; she was
