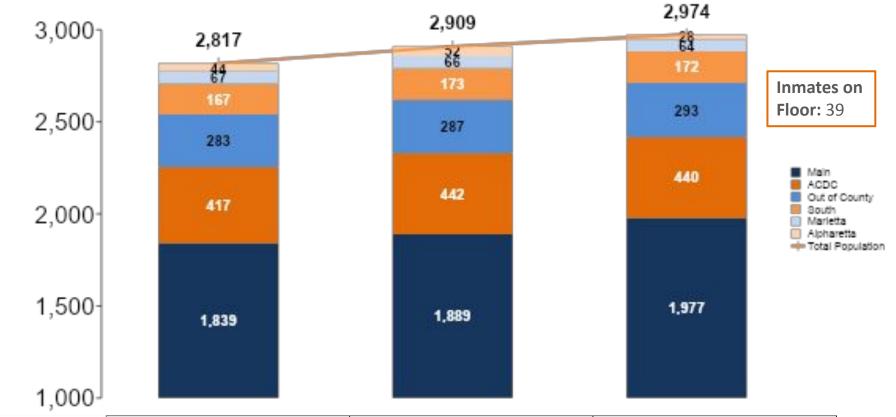

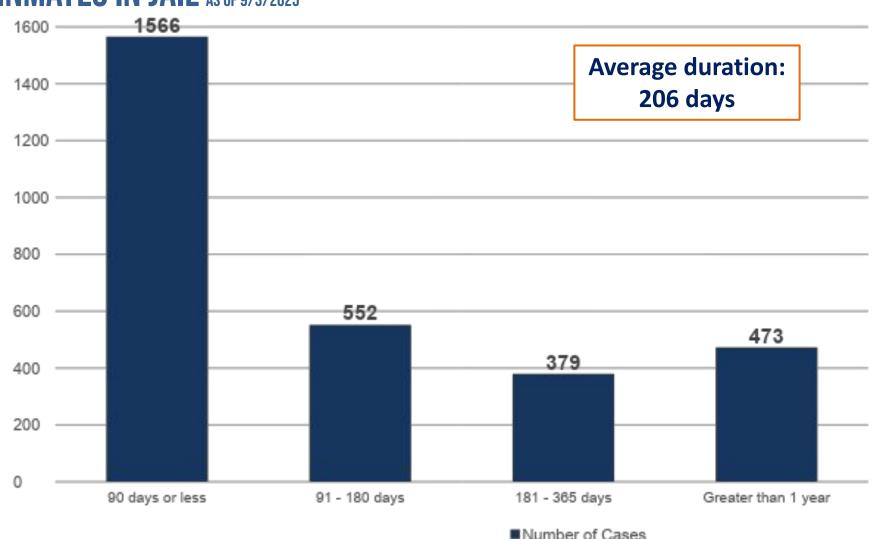

# LENGTH OF STAY FOR CURRENTLY INCARCERATED



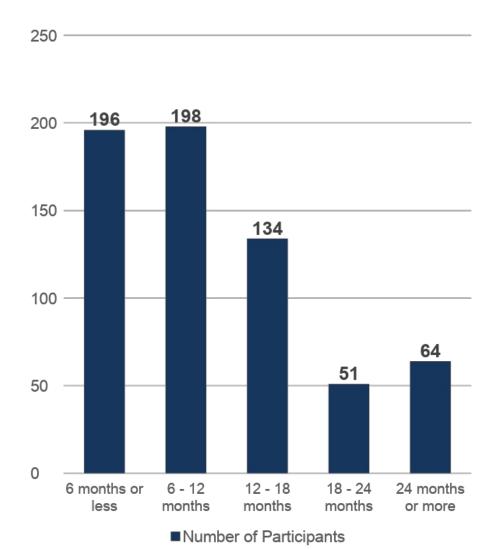
### INMATES IN JAIL AS OF 9/3/2025

#### **Program Update**

- Number of active monitors down from 1,108 (Aug 31, 2024) to 643 (Sept 1, 2025)
- Continuous bimonthly status reviews of EM cases prioritized by length of time on monitor and severity of charges
- Superior Court has implemented new bond order with 6-month default for monitor & pretrial services removal
- Any extension beyond 6 months requires written order from judge

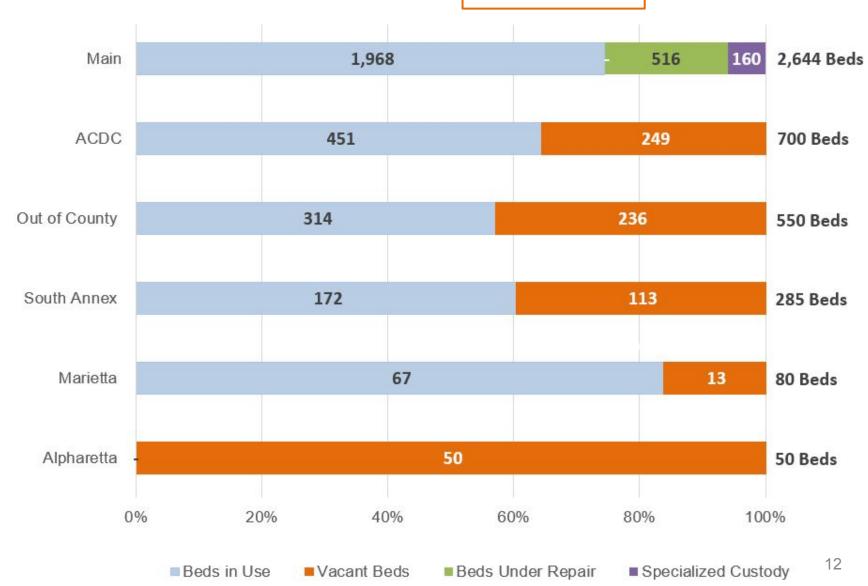

**Specialized Custody**: inmate classification, competency, discipline, protective custody



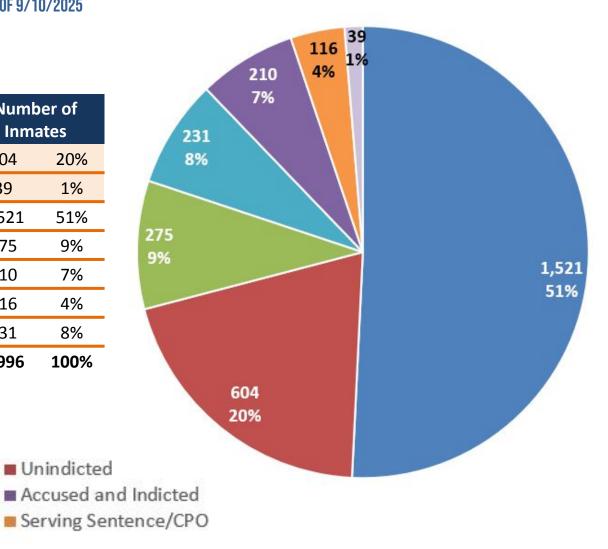

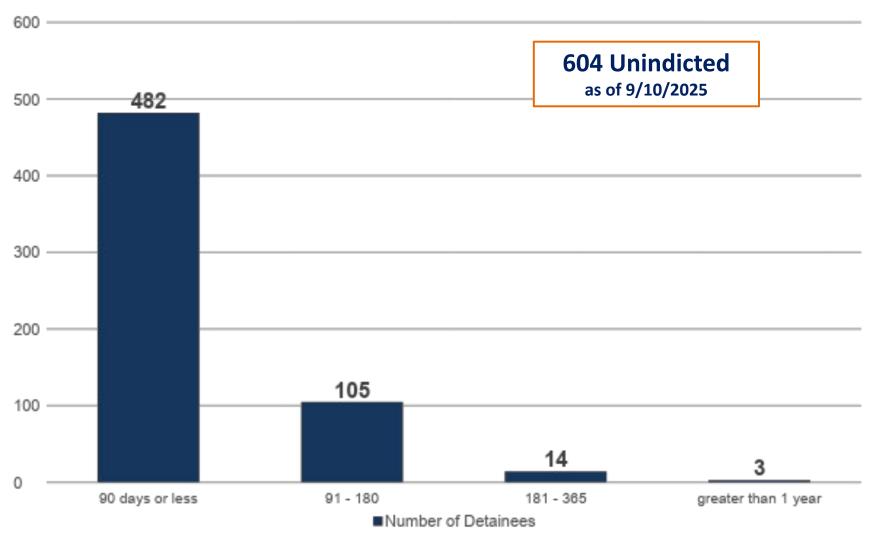

#### Overall Blitz Project Update

- o 9 of 11 housing units completed = 82%
- O 3 North completed on August 14, 2025
- Current blitz areas: 3 South & 7 South
  - FCSO determined that 7 South was critical for housing maximum security classification residents
  - 3 South critical for housing residents requiring physical and behavioral health concerns.
- Phase 1 blitz completion: End of October 2025
- Phase 2 Blitz to begin in Q1 2026

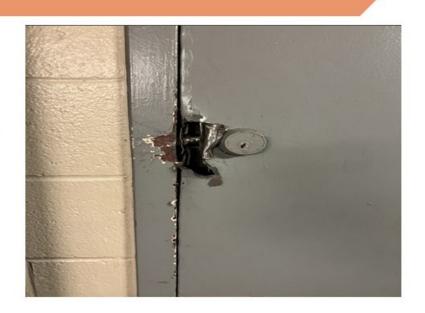
#### **Action Taken/Next Steps**

- New maintenance contractor began at Jail South Annex on 9/10/2025
- 1<sup>st</sup> of 5 additional FTE's added to main jail maintenance team on 9/2/2025
- EMSI conducts monthly analysis of maintenance performance data.

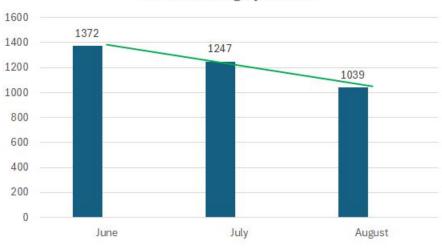
### **Work Order Backlog**

- On average, 1,500 work orders are created each month
  - o 800 work orders submitted by EMSI per month
  - Approx. 700 work orders per month are initiated by FCSO staff
- Maintenance averaging 1,200 completed work orders per month
  - Average time to complete = 2.5 days
  - Base contract staffing = 18 technicians
  - 1st of 5 additional FTE's added to main jail maintenance team on 9/2/2025
  - Backlog goal of < 500 open work orders by December 2025.

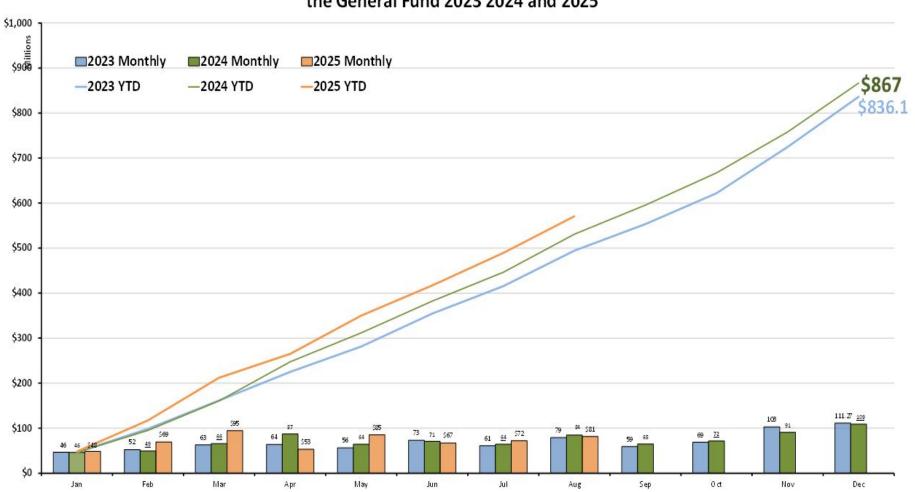
