Annie Jewel Moore is the oldest living Spelman alumnus at the age of 105; she graduated in 1943 with a degree in Economics and is recognized as one of the first African Americans to study at the Traphagen School of Fashion, the New York Fashion Academy, and École Guerre Lavigna in Paris, France; and



WHEREAS,

Annie discovered her passion for sewing after meeting the daughter of a family friend who showed off her

sewing skills; she worked on Broadway show costumes

after graduating from school, and Vogue and Jet magazines published her creations; and

in 1963, she opened Ann Moore Couturiere in Detroit, Michigan, which was the city's sole black-owned haute

couture salon and included day and evening attire; later in Atlanta, she set up and served as President of the Benefactors of Education, Inc., a foundation that provided scholarships and aid to students interested in



WHEREAS,

in 2023 one of Annie's favorite designs, the UbiquiSix - a six-piece garment that could transition a woman from day

to evening, was featured at the Rountree Visual Vault; and



WHEREAS,

because of her, we are BETTER, STRONGER, AND WISER; Annie's trailblazing career has paved the way for countless other people of color to follow in her footsteps;
