



More than a shelter

- 50,000sqft facility
- In addition to shelter space, the facility will include purpose-built spaces for pet adoption, veterinary services, training and socialization and more.
- Capacity for 367 dogs, 99 cats, 18 chickens, a dozen small animals and six larger livestock animals
- 54,000sqft dedicated to a pasture







Selection and Approval Process

Selection Process:

- Meeting #1: Orientation (6/15)
- Meeting #2: Finalist Selection (7/14)
- Meeting #3: Site meeting with finalists (7/27)
- Meeting #4: Proposal Review (8/14 8/18)

Approvals:

- Fulton County Arts Council (AC)
- Fulton County Board of Commissioners (BOC)



Payment Process for Proposals

- 1. Register as a County vendor and activate your account with Gibran/Richard
- 2. Send invoice with vendor code to Alex Frankcombe
- 3. Payment schedule:
 - 100% Once proposal received
- 4. Payment typically takes 10-15 business days once we send the invoice to AP



Proposal Requirements and Deadlines

- All proposals to be submitted via email
- For those seeking feedback on draft proposals content for review due no later than COB 8/8
- Proposals due 8/13
- All questions or requests for information should be sent via email to: <u>Alex.Frankcombe@fultoncountyga.gov</u>
- Do not contact architects or other staff outside of this method. All answers and information requests will be shared with all applicants.



Proposal Content and Assessment

- Proposal should include the following:
 - A narrative description of the proposed artwork
 - Technical/Installation information e.g. how you plan to paint the mural, equipment, materials/paint types etc.
 - Timeline from appointment to installation
 - Conceptual design of the mural
- Your proposal will be assessed using the following criteria:
 - Artistic excellence and quality of the design
 - The extent to which the design meets the desired objectives
 - Appropriateness of the design (for a County owned-facility and for the Animal Services Facility)



Artwork Objectives:

- The primary objective of this mural is to convey the purpose of the Animal Services Facility, celebrate the animals within it, and evoke the emotional connection between humans and their adopted pets.
- The artwork should capture the joy, compassion, and love that accompanies the process of adopting an animal.
- The wall will ideally become the backdrop for residents and their new family member.
- The mural must incorporate the Fulton County logo, representing our commitment to animal welfare.



Commission information

- Budget: \$25,000 inclusive of all costs (transport, material, installation, wall prep and topcoat for UV protection)
- Wall size:
 - Wall 1: 12' (W) x 19'(H)
 - Wall 2: 12' (W) x 19'(H)
- The finished surface will be unpainted CMU Veneer
- The site will be open M-F from 7 AM 6 PM
- The space will be ready to paint in mid-end of September and the final completion date is October 9, 2023.
- Grand opening November 2023










