Korey opened his first retail locations at Greenbriar Mall and Old National's Discount Mall, and quickly expanded retail stores across the city, opening doors for indie artists in Atlanta; and

Korey's legacy is now being handled by his children: Narie, Nako, Big Korey, and DJ Montay, ensuring that his legacy continues to leave an indelible mark on the music industry;
