A RESOLUTION OF THE FULTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
DIRECTING THE COUNTY MANAGER AND COUNTY ATTORNEY TO CONDUCT AN
ASSESSMENT OF THE FEASIBILITY OF ALLOWING PRO BONO LEGAL CLINICS
TO SERVE AS A RESOURCE FOR CITIZENS FROM TIME TO TIME OR ON A
RECURRING BASIS AT FULTON COUNTY LIBRARIES; AND FOR OTHER
PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Fulton County Board of Commissioners aims to promote access to legal assistance for Fulton County residents who desire to protect their rights and understand the court system, and recognizes an ongoing need for assistance with landlord/tenant matters, family law issues, filling out necessary forms and court paperwork, and other matters; and

WHEREAS, the Fulton County Board of Commissioners recognizes that access to legal resources and information promotes the fair and just adjudication of court cases and empowers residents to approach any legal issue with confidence, both in and outside the courtroom; and

WHEREAS, availability of legal assistance improves judicial efficiency and alleviates the burden of providing information to the public from judges and court staff; and

WHEREAS, the Atlanta legal community includes numerous non-profit legal organizations and pro bono attorneys with experience providing free legal resources, information, programming, and advice to the public; and

WHEREAS, Fulton County enjoys several productive partnerships with local legal organizations and pro bono attorneys, such as the programs offered at the Justice Resource Center located in the Fulton County Courthouse; and

WHEREAS, the excellent assistance provided at the Fulton County Courthouse necessarily has logistical limitations due to a singular location downtown and the lack of evening or weekend hours at the facility; and

WHEREAS, many Fulton County Library System locations are open during weekends and are located throughout Fulton County, such that they are well positioned to provide access to legal assistance to the public; and

WHEREAS, the Fulton County Board of Commissioners desires that Fulton County facilities and resources be available for pro bono clinics and other free legal assistance programming to the greatest extent feasible without disruption to existing Fulton County functions or undue burden on Fulton County employees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Fulton County Board of Commissioners hereby directs the County Manager and the County Attorney to conduct an assessment of the feasibility of allowing pro bono clinics to serve as a resource for citizens from time to time or on a recurring basis by providing for free legal assistance programs at facilities within the Fulton County Library System.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Manager, in consultation with the Director of the Fulton County Library System, shall include in his assessment the availability of, and impact on, facilities, personnel, and existing Fulton County programming and activities, and the extent to which such resources can be provided equitably throughout the County through the inclusion of facilities located in the northern, central, and southern areas of Fulton County.

1	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Attorney shall include in her
2	assessment any legal requirements or limitations on the assistance that may be offered
3	at Fulton County facilities.
4	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this Resolution will take effect upon its adoption,
5	and that all ordinances, resolutions, and parts of ordinances and resolutions in conflict
6	with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
