Harold worked on several Atlanta radio stations, including WRAS-FM, WIGO, WAOK, WABE-FM, V-103, and KISS 104.1; he also was a news and sports reporter for the Atlanta Voice newspaper, and hosted his own television show on Atlanta Interfaith Broadcast(AIB) cable channel called *Round Town with Hal Lamar*; and



WHEREAS, Harold was the founding member of the Atlanta

Association of Black Journalists, and most recently worked

as a freelance writer for the Atlanta Inquirer; and



Harold was honored by several media organizations, including the Atlanta Association of Black Journalists, the

National Association of Black Journalists, and he was named "Sportswriter-Sportscaster of the Year" by the 100% Wrong Club of Atlanta; he also received several awards, including the Communications Award from the



Concerned Black Clergy, the Malcolm X Self

Determination Award by the Malcolm X grassroots movement of Atlanta, and the Drum Major for Justice

Award by SCLC Women;
