
Update - COVID 19 Reserve & ARPA Spend

INCIDENT RESPONSE REVIEW

- Covid Deaths are now 0.6 deaths a day, the lowest 7-day average since last June. (Remember deaths are a lagging indicator by 4 to 6 weeks from a surge in cases)
- Hospitalizations & % positive deaths have plateaued for the last few weeks.
- Cases have continued to rise slowly, (reported Case counts are thought to be at least ½ of the real case count, due to milder symptoms for the vaccinated population and the difficulty in tracking at home testing).
- BA.2 variant now accounts for 66% of all new cases while 30% are from a new sub-variant BA.2.12.1 & OMICRON is 4%
- BA.2.12.1 is quickly becoming the dominant variant in the US
- BA.2.12.1 is more transmissible than its predecessors



Lineages called using pangolin v4.0.5 and pangolin-data v1.3.


Lineage BA.1.1 and its sublineages are aggregated with B.1.1.529 at the regional level as they currently cannot be reliably called in each region.

- The OMICRON variant (purple) accounts for 4%,




Inset Case Rate Fulton County 4-27-22






4-27-2022 COVID-19 Bed Use Projection

- —COVID Bed Use Best Case







Fulton County COVID-19

- o 7-day average for cases is 94, up 31% since the last BoC mtg.
- 7-day average for % positive is 4.0%, same as the last BoC mtg.
- 7-day average, hospitalizations is 57, down 10% since the last BoC mtg.
- 7 day average, for deaths is 0.6, down 75% since the last BoC mtg.








Multi-level wastewater monitoring in Fulton County

Testing at **nested sites** at multiple geographic levels

- Treatment Plants* (adding 4 sites for County wide coverage)
 Wastewater SCAN and GDPH NWSS
- Community manholes (adding 20 sites for County wide coverage)
 Emory Research Team / FC
- Institutions
 Emory Research Team / FC



*The CDC NWSS program currently accepts data at the treatment plant level only, both SCAN and GDPH submit data to NWSS



COVID-19 TESTING CAPACITY

Federal home test kit program is available. Each household is eligible for 4 test kits.

Fulton County, BoH, Ryan White Antigen Test Kits

- •We distributed 68% of the test kits
- We are maintaining 32% of the test kits for future response



Developed a new testing model with one of our 3rd party testing partners

- PCR testing kiosks
- Employee / Family Use
- Future expansion to allow all citizens access
- Kiosk will dispense a self swab test kits & a sample collection box will be co-located
- Results will be delivered in 48 to 72 hrs
- Fulton County's first three units will be in the government center, the courthouse and Rice Street



Facilities:

 Implemented mask policy that strongly encourages use of masks by visitors and employees except in tax offices, jail and clinical settings which are still required.

Courts:

- Voters can't be required to wear a mask.
- If a voter requests a mask, one can be made available.
