

George Clinton was born on July 22, 1941 in Kannapolis, North Carolina and began his career in the 1950's as a Doo-Wop singer with The Parliaments, which later became the influential Parliament-Funkadelic collective; the group merged funk, rock, soul, and psychedelia into a distinctive sound, producing hits like *Give Up the Funk (Tear the Roof Off the Sucker)* and *One Nation Under a Groove*; and



WHEREAS,

George Clinton's groundbreaking contributions to funk, rock, R&B, and hip-hop earned him induction into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame in 1997 and the Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award in 2019; his creativity has influenced generations of artists, from Prince to Kendrick Lamar, and many others; and



WHEREAS,

George Clinton has also dedicated much of his life to community service and philanthropic work that includes partnerships with various nonprofit organizations; his involvement in music education programs has provided young people with access to instruments, mentorship, and

performance opportunities; and

George Clinton advocates for racial equality and social

justice, supporting community-driven solutions to poverty and inequality; he is a strong advocate for empowering

underserved young people, encouraging them to pursue their creative passions and believe in their potential to make a difference; and

George Clinton was initiated into Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. on July 24, 2020, and he is the proud husband of Carlon

Thompson-Clinton;

Sean relocated to Atlanta, Georgia in 2004 after several successful collaborations with prominent Atlanta figures including Bonecrusher, who notably donned on of Sean's designs in Ciara's *Goodies* music video; and

Sean's rapping and songwriting talents led to a production deal with Bonecrusher, which eventually led to an independent career in the music industry; he played a pivotal role in nurturing Atlanta's underground music scene and collaborations with many international artists; and

Sean has curated several events that have enriched Atlanta's cultural landscape and stimulates local economic activity; he also co-founded *Get Brunch*, a pioneering event that set the standard for the Black brunch experience in Atlanta; and



WHEREAS,

Sean expanded his artistic repertoire by transitioning to DJing, providing soundtracks for major events and collaborations including Adidas, MLS, NFL, and Coca-Cola; he also hosts *Meet Me Here*, a weekly gathering that attracts politicians, city council members, artists, and entertainers, co-founded Atlanta's *SKIP DAY*, which encourages professionals to take a mental health day to unwind and network, and he spearheaded *Sum'n Good Party*, a house party-style event that offers an intimate alternative to traditional club experiences, promoting genuine relationships through music;
