Overview

The proposed FY25 Contracts for Services (CFS) Awards recommendations highlight the significant impact of the additional \$1.7 million in funding approved at the September 17 BOC meeting. This new allocation builds upon the \$1.3 million in awards approved in June, raising the total FY25 funding to \$3 million. In a year marked by economic uncertainty, this investment provides sustaining support that positions award recipients Page | for long-term success. The additional \$1.7 million expands the program to 18 more recipients—including non- 4 profits, individual artists, and one municipality—bringing the total number of awards to 176.

Why Additional Funding Matters

1. Stability for Returning Recipients

- The initial \$1.3 million allocation required deep reductions, leaving some eligible organizations and artists unfunded. This created long-term risks for small and mid-sized partners.
- The additional \$1.7 million restores funding for returning recipients and strengthens equity and sustainability across the portfolio.

2. Expansion to Additional Recipients

The new allocation supports 18 organizations and individuals that were unfunded at the \$1.3 million level, broadening the program's reach and impact.

3. Countywide Equity

- Every district benefit from the expanded funding, ensuring geographic balance.
- The additional investment reflects Fulton County's commitment to equitable support for both long-standing institutions and grassroots/emerging organizations.

4. Raising the Total Allocation

 Approval of the proposed \$1.7 million increase to the FY25 CFS Awards, raises the total allocation to \$3 million and ensures stability, expansion, and equitable impact across Fulton County's arts and culture ecosystem.

Funding Allocation Decision Process

In April and May, the Allocation Committee and Arts Council reviewed and approved applications for the initial \$1.3 million in funding. At the same time, they also identified recommendations for distributing any potential additional funding later in the year.

Review Process Overview

All applications go through a four-tiered review process before final Board of Commissioner approval including Staff Review, Community Peer Panel Reviews, Allocation Committee Review and allocation recommendations, and Arts Council Review and approval.

Staff Review

- Applications are screened for eligibility and completeness. Key requirements include:
- Applicant must be based in Fulton County (street address required, not just a PO Box).
- Proposed activities must take place in Fulton County venues.

- Nonprofits must provide Georgia incorporation documents and IRS 501(c)(3) status.
- Applications must include all required forms, attachments, and project dates within the 2025 funding cycle.

Peer Panel Reviews

- Applications are reviewed by community panels, grouped into funding categories:
- Operating Support Funds (OSF) and Project Support Funds (PSF): reviewed by organizational budget tiers.
- Resource Providers Fund (RPF), Small Project Funds (SAPF), Emerging Arts Fund (EAF), and Other: reviewed separately.
- The "Other" category includes applicants with recurring application issues; they receive technical assistance to improve compliance.
- Panels evaluate applications based on artistic quality, community impact, organizational strength, and accessibility and score based the criteria. Applications can receive a score of 0-112 points

Allocation Committee

- The committee is made up of Arts Council members, community arts experts, one staff representative, and the FCAC Director (ex-officio).
- They review panel scores, consensus statements, funding history, and rankings.
- Establishes a formula based on scores, requests, and historical funding.
- Committee recommendations combine panel, staff, and committee input before advancing to the Arts Council.

Arts Council Review

The Arts Council reviews all recommendations and makes adjustments if needed to:

- Address underfunded categories.
- Support organizations aligned with County priorities.
- The Council then forwards final recommendations to the Board of Commissioners for approval.
