

Proclamation



WHEREAS,

The National Coalition of 100 Black Women, Inc. (NCBW) was founded in 1981 in New York City and is an advocacy organization whose vision is that Black women and girls will live in a world where socio-economic inequity does not exist; and



WHEREAS,

NCBW advocates on behalf of Black women and girls to promote leadership development and gender equity in the areas of health, education, economic development, and public policy advocacy actions; and



WHEREAS,

with 62 chapters in 26 states, and members that range in age from 25 to 95, NCBW believes in inclusion, respect, racial and social justice, integrity, accountability, and collaboration; and



WHEREAS,

during fiscal year 2020-2021, more than 19,500 youth were served in mentoring and STEM programs, more than 175,000 individuals attended workshops and training events, over \$800,000 in local scholarships were awarded to students in financial need, and more than 75,000 people were served via voter registration, strategic partnerships, and community forums;



NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Fulton County Board of Commissioners, in commemoration of Women's History Month, recognizes the National Coalition of 100 Black Women, Inc. for their positive impact on their Local communities and beyond, and does hereby proclaim Wednesday, March 2, 2022 as "**100 BLACK WOMEN APPRECIATION DAY**" in Fulton County, Georgia.
