RESOLUTION BY THE FULTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO ACKNOWLEDGE THE IMPORTANCE OF DIGITAL EQUITY; TO URGE THE U.S. CONGRESS TO RENEW OR EXTEND THE AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM (ACP) THROUGH 2024 SO THAT ALL QUALIFYING HOUSEHOLDS IN FULTON COUNTY, GEORGIA WILL HAVE ACCESS TO AFFORDABLE HIGH-SPEED INTERNET SERVICE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, equity in education, in healthcare, in the workforce, and in all aspects of modern life is only achievable if you have a computer, an internet connection, and digital skills; and

WHEREAS, the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) was enacted through the bipartisan Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act of 2021 to make high-speed internet plans more affordable for consumers and to encourages internet service providers (ISPs) to invest in more communities; and

WHEREAS, ISPs that receive federal infrastructure deployment funds are mandated to participate in ACP so that future customers will not be priced out of those new connections; and

WHEREAS, ACP has provided \$14.2 billion in support since its inception, allowing over 20 Million American households to benefit from ACP, including 625,000 households in Georgia and 65,797 households in Fulton County; and

WHEREAS, approximately 15% of Fulton County households risk disconnection from their internet service if ACP is not to continue, leaving families without access to healthcare services, school programming, and workforce opportunities; and

WHEREAS, polls have shown that over 75% of voters support funding for ACP, including overwhelming support across political ideologies; and

WHEREAS, unless Congress acts to renew or extend ACP, its funds will be exhausted by spring 2024, leaving millions of Americans without affordable access to internet service; and

WHEREAS, without ACP, American tax dollars will be supporting the growth of forprofit ISPs with no public benefit; and

WHEREAS, on January 11th, 2024, the Federal Communications Commission announced that they will wind down the ACP program and will stop accepting new enrollments on February 7, 2024, unless Congress appropriates additional funding.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Fulton County Board of Commissioners acknowledges the importance of digital equity for its citizens.

 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fulton County Board of Commissioners hereby urges the U.S. Congress to renew or extend the Affordable Connectivity Program through 2024, so that all qualifying households in Fulton County, Georgia will have access to affordable high-speed internet service.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Clerk to the Commission is hereby authorized and directed upon passage of this Resolution to send copies of this Resolution to the Georgia Congressional Delegation, the Chairpersons and ranking members of the House and Senate Appropriations committees.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall become effective upon its adoption and that all resolutions and parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
