# RESOLUTION TO ESTABLISH NEW SUPPLEMENTS AND SALARIES FOR CERTAIN ELECTED AND APPOINTED JUDICIAL OFFICIALS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the last time the Board of Commissioners comprehensively evaluated the compensation of many of the County's elected officials and state appointees was on January 21,1998, when it adopted "Resolution Providing for an Increase in Compensation for Fulton County Employees" ("1998 Compensation Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, on November 17, 2021, in Agenda Item No. 21-0913, the Department of Human Resources Management ("DHRM") presented the Board of Commissioners with a proposal to establish new salaries and/or county supplements for elected and appointed officials to the extent allowed by law and where such authority is vested in the Board of Commissioners; and

WHEREAS, DHRM's compensation model did not include tethering the salaries or supplements for elected and appointed officials to the compensation of other elected officials; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners, recognizing the salaries and/or county supplements of certain elected and appointed officials are not currently at market rates based on the size of their operations and the compensation of their counterparts in other counties, approved the new compensation model presented by DHRM which is based on specific roles of each official and departs from using a waterfall approach that tethers the total compensation to the Superior and State Court Judges of Fulton County.

#### Probate Judge

**WHEREAS**, the base salary of the Probate Judge of Fulton County is set forth in O.C.G.A. § 15-9-63(a); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 15-9-63(a)(3) a county supplement paid to the Probate Judge of Fulton County may be established by the county governing authority or the General Assembly by local law; and

WHEREAS, in 2015, the Board of Commissioners passed Resolution No. 2015-0943 which established a county supplement for the Probate Judge; and

WHEREAS, Section 1(a) of 2017 Ga. L. 3948 purportedly established the annual salary of the Probate Judge as equal to ninety percent (90%) of the total state salary plus the county supplement now or hereafter paid to a judge of the Superior Court of Fulton County but has been interpreted as establishment of a county supplement for the Probate Judge since the annual base salary of a county probate judge is set by general law, specifically O.C.G.A. § 15-9-63(a); and

WHEREAS, the Section 1(a) of 2017 Ga. L. 3948 superseded Resolution No. 2015-0943;

35 and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners, via Resolution No. 2022-0191, has initiated its Home Rule power to repeal Section 1(a) of 2017 Ga. L. 3948 and to permit the Board of Commissioners to adopt a new supplement for the Probate Judge.

## State Court Judge

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 15-7-22, the salary of a state court judge shall be paid "as provided by local law"; and

WHEREAS, 2017 Ga. L. 3948 established the salary of a state court judge as "equal to 95 percent of the total of the state salary plus the county supplement now or hereafter paid to a judge of the Superior Court of Fulton County;" and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 15-7-22, the county governing authority may provide for a supplement to a state court judge; and

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners has not adopted a current County supplement for the Fulton County State Court Judges.

# **Chief Magistrate and Other Magistrates**

WHEREAS, the base salary of a full-time chief magistrate is set forth in O.C.G.A. § 15-10-23(a)(2), and the minimum monthly salary for other full-time magistrates is set forth in O.C.G.A. § 15-10-23(a)(4); and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 15-10-23(d), "[t]he county governing authority may supplement the minimum annual salary of the chief or other magistrate in such amount as it may fix from time to time..."; and

WHEREAS, on October 21, 2015, the Board of Commissioners adopted Resolution No. 2015-0943 which established a county supplement of not less than \$6,000 for the Chief Magistrate Judge but has not adopted a general supplement.

## Juvenile Court Judges and Associate Juvenile Court Judges

WHEREAS, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 15-11-52(b), the salary of judges of a Juvenile Court, other than associate judges, is set by the Superior Court with the approval of the governing authority; and

WHEREAS, in the 1998 Compensation Resolution, the salary for a juvenile court judge was set as "equal to ninety percent (90%) of the total compensation of the Superior Court Judges including the percentage of any increase in State compensation of Superior Court Judges which may be received July 1, 1998"; and

WHEREAS, the General Assembly in 2000, in 2000 Ga. L. 3904, adopted a base salary for the Juvenile Court Judges using the same amount listed in the 1998 Compensation

Resolution, as ninety percent (90%) of the state salary plus county supplement paid to a superior court judge; and

WHEREAS, in 2015 the Board of Commissioners passed Resolution No. 2015-0943 which established a county supplement for the Chief Judge of Juvenile Court; and

WHEREAS, Section 1(a) of 2017 Ga. L. 3948 passed by the General Assembly, continued the annual salary of the Juvenile Court Judges as equal to ninety percent (90%) of the total state salary plus the county supplement now or hereafter paid to a judge of the Superior Court of Fulton County; and

WHEREAS, there is no authority for a county supplement as established in Resolution No. 2015-0943; and

WHEREAS, there is no authority for the General Assembly to establish the salary of Juvenile Court Judges as established in 2017 Ga. L. 3948; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners, via Resolution No. 2022-0191, has initiated its Home Rule power to repeal Section 1(a) of 2017 Ga. L. 3948 to eliminate superfluous local law that conflicts with general law regarding the establishment of the salary for the Juvenile Court Judges; and

WHEREAS, DHRM has confirmed that the Superior Court supports the proposed salary presented for the Juvenile Court Judges; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to O.C.G.A. § 15-11-60, the salary of an associate juvenile court judge is set by the juvenile court judge by whom s/he is appointed with the approval of the county governing authority; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the 1998 Compensation Resolution, the Board of Commissioners established the salary of Associate Juvenile Court Judges to be "equal to seventy-five (75%) of the total compensation of the State Court Judges including the percentage of any increase the State Court Judges may receive as a result of increase in State Compensation of Superior Court Judges which may be received July 1, 1998"; and

WHEREAS, DHRM has confirmed that the Juvenile Court Judge, who appoints all Associate Juvenile Court Judges, supports the proposed salary presented for the Associate Juvenile Court Judges.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners hereby adopts a new county supplement for the Probate Judge as outlined in the <u>Salaries and Supplements</u> <u>Schedule</u> attached hereto subject to final adoption of Home Rule Resolution No. 2022-0191 repealing Section 1(a) of 2017 Ga. L. 3948.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners hereby adopts new county supplements for the State Court Judges, Chief Magistrate and Other Magistrates as outlined in the <u>Salaries and Supplements Schedule</u> attached hereto.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Board of Commissioners hereby adopts new salaries for the Chief Juvenile Court Judge, Juvenile Court Judges, and Associate Juvenile Court Judges as outlined in the <u>Salaries and Supplements Schedule attached hereto</u>.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that this Resolution is not intended to replace, repeal or supersede 2013 Ga. L. 4392, a local act of the General Assembly, which provides for an additional supplement specific to the chief judge role in State Court.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that, with respect to the Chief Juvenile Court Judge, this Resolution is intended to replace, repeal and supersede Resolution No. 2015-0493 passed by the Board of Commissioners, thereby eliminating the supplement specific to the chief judge role in the Juvenile Court.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that whenever the state employees subject to compensation plans authorized and approved in accordance with O.C.G.A. §45-20-4 receive a cost-of-living increase or general performance based increase of a certain percentage or a certain amount, the amounts to which the Chief Juvenile Court Judge, Juvenile Court Judges and Associate Juvenile Court Judges are entitled shall be increased by the same percentage or same amount applicable to such state employees. If the cost-of-living increase or general performance based increase received by state employees is in different percentages or different amounts as to certain categories of employees, the amounts to which the Chief Juvenile Court Judge, Juvenile Court Judge and Associate Juvenile Court Judge are entitled shall be increased by the highest percentage rate or amount from that which is applied to the other judicial officials herein.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that this Resolution shall be effective on April 13, 2022 for bi-weekly payments and on April 23, 2022 for monthly payments.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that DHRM shall review the salaries and supplements of the elected and appointed officials referenced herein in tandem and as part of future county-wide classification and compensation salary surveys.

**BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that all resolutions and parts of resolutions in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict.

### SALARIES AND SUPPLEMENTS SCHEDULE

The county supplement for each of the officials listed below shall be fixed as follows:

(1) Probate Judge <sup>A</sup> \$60,8	68
(2) State Court Judge\$ 3,1	
(3) Chief Magistrate\$66,8	68
(4) Other Full-Time Magistrate\$48,4	72

The annual salary of each of the officials listed below shall be fixed as follows:

(1) Chief Juvenile Court Judge	\$179,192
(2) Juvenile Court Judge	
(3) Associate Juvenile Court Judge	\$162.801

The hourly rate of each of the officials listed below shall be fixed as follows:

(1) Part-Time Magistrate ......\$83.00/hr1

Whenever the state employees subject to compensation plans authorized and approved in accordance with O.C.G.A. §45-20-4 receive a cost-of-living increase or general performance based increase of a certain percentage or a certain amount, the amounts to which the Chief Juvenile Court Judge, a Juvenile Court Judge and an Associate Juvenile Court Judge are entitled shall be increased by the same percentage or same amount applicable to such state employees. If the cost-of-living increase or general performance based increase received by state employees is in different percentages or different amounts as to certain categories of employees, the amounts to which the Chief Juvenile Court Judge, Juvenile Court Judge and Associate Juvenile Court Judge are entitled shall be increased by the highest percentage rate or amount from that which is applied to other judicial officials.
