2022 CSP Program Highlights

96,184 Fulton County Citizens Served

- **Children & Youth Services** – Agape Community Center, Inc. **reported 90%** of the program’s high school graduates transitioned to college, vocation or full time employment. Out of 92 enrolled middle and high school students, 96% demonstrated decreased or no delinquent behaviors.
- **Disabilities** - Erin’s Hope for Friends, Inc. **served a total of 350 teens and young adults on the spectrum** through their “e’s Club: a social experience for autistic teens and young adults” program. Through a combination of in-person and virtual sessions, program participants significantly reduced anxiety and have increased their participation in social outings.
- **Economic Stability/Poverty** – Community Assistance Center, Inc. **provided emergency financial assistance to 208 residents**, from 90 households in Sandy Springs. The Adult Education Program enrolled 652 students. The ESOL program enrolled 302 students, with an additional 124 students completing the ESOL program.
- **Health and Wellness** - Ascensa Health, Inc. (formerly St. Jude’s Recovery Center) **served 96 individuals** through the Residential Treatment program, which include behavioral, mental and physical health treatment services. Thirty (30) individuals transitioned to permanent housing after exiting residential treatment. Thirty-six (36) residential clients found employment through the Ascensa Employment Services program.
- **Homelessness** – Covenant House Georgia, Inc. **served 366 individuals**. Forty-eight (48) youth enrolled in the Transitional Living program, surpassing the goal of 20. One hundred and fifty-five (155) youth were assisted with applying for and receiving cash or non-cash benefits, surpassing the yearly goal of 100.
- **Seniors Services** – Nehemiah Project Community Development Corporation, Inc. **completed 25 senior client home repairs** during the 2022 contract year, surpassing the targeted goal of 15. The repairs enabled seniors to remain in the community and age-in-place.
