
Update - COVID 19 Reserve & ARPA Spend

INCIDENT RESPONSE REVIEW

- The 7-day average for cases, hospitalizations, % positives are at record highs.
- 92% of all new cases are from the OMICRON variant
- 70% of all new cases are from unvaccinated, 96% of all new hospitalizations are from unvaccinated, 96% of all new deaths are from unvaccinated
- Fulton County Covid hospitalizations have increased 667%, Pediatric COVID admissions are up 771% since the last BOC
- Three of the major indicators on the Fulton County COVID scorecard are red (% positives, cases, hospitalizations and one is green (deaths)


How CDC measures the county level of community transmission...

 - Percent Positive


Def of total new cases - A county's rate of new COVID-19 infections reported over the past 7 day period of time per 100,000 residents.

Def of percent positivity - Percentage of positive COVID-19 tests in a county over the past 7 day period of time




Breakthrough Cases Last 14 Days





Confirmed Covid-19 Deaths by Vaccination Status








Fulton County COVID-19

- 7-day average for cases is 2075, up 1687% since the last BoC mtg.
- 7-day average for % positive is 36.6%, up 813% since the last BoC mtg.
- 7-day average, Hospitalizations is 1000, up 685% since the last BoC mtg.
- 7 day average, for deaths is 0.4, down 200% since the last BoC mtg.



VACCINATION RESPONSE

- 533,500 1st & 2nd vaccines & 11,000 Boosters have administered at Fulton County fixed and mobile sites
- Over 40,500 doses of vaccines have been administered via the Fulton County mobile vaccination units
- 2 mobile units will be at 10 locations this week
- ***<u>INCENTIVES</u>***
 - To date Fulton County has incentivised over 2700 individuals with \$100
 - Fulton County Residents ONLY
 - Planning to resume incentives soon
- Boosters now approved for all over 12
- Early data on the effectiveness of boosters on the Omicron variant shows 25 times more protection








Fulton County Map of Mobile Vaccination Sites

Vaccination Response Path Forward 2022



INCREASING CAPACITY

- Will have a total of 6 fixed sites and 2 mobile units administering boosters as well as 1st & 2nd doses.
 - (Daily vaccination capacity increased by 63% from 600 to 975)
 - Fixed Sites
 - 4700 (200 vax/day) Tuesday Saturday
 - Aviation (200 vax/day) Tuesday Saturday
 - Stone Wall Tell Road (200 vax/day) Tuesday Saturday
 - College Park Board of Health Clinic (75 vax/day)
 - Adamsville Board of Health Clinic (75 vax/day)
 - Mobile Units
 - 2 units available for mobile opportunities (75 vax/day per mobile unit)

Our new vaccination model will provide us flexibility, as well as capability, to adjust our program as demand wanes or if there is a need to target portions of our community.

Vaccination Response Path Forward 2022



- Increasing options for evening vaccination opportunities
- Leverage Board of Health Equity Grant and other funding sources to support COVID response.
- Leverage existing CORE EPI case investigation teams to perform at home testing & vaccine
- Unified advertising and community outreach program
- Incentives
 - Approximately \$250,000 in incentives have been distributed to 2,700 individuals
 - Will continue to leverage financial incentives to encourage any persuadable citizens to get their first and second doses



At-Home COVID Test Kits

Four Key Assumptions:


- 1. Continued high public demand for testing-long lines, lack of available appointments
- 2. COVID -19 Positivity rate over 10% for next 4 weeks
- 3. Consumers remain concerned about cost and access to home test kits
- 4. Federal home test kits may not be immediately available to Fulton County residents






