

INCIDENT RESPONSE REVIEW


- Fulton County: There have been more Covid deaths attributed to OMICRON (430) than Delta (232) last summer, (92% of those deaths were from the unvaccinated population).
- Cases, % positives & hospitalizations have significantly increased since last BoC, (Cases and % positives are now in the red zone)
- *Reported case counts are now thought to be underreported by 3x.
 Due to milder symptoms for the vaccinated population and the difficulty in tracking at home testing.
- BA.2 variant now accounts for 36% of all new cases while 62% are from a new sub-variant BA.2.12.1 & OMICRON is now 2%
- ✤ BA.2.12.1 is more transmissible than its predecessors
- Vaccine: 1st Booster now available for 5 and over. 2nd booster for those over 55 and four months since 1st booster







BA.2 is 40% more contagious than the original omicron. BA.2.12 is even more contagious




Community Risk Map

Community Transmission Map











5-25-2022 COVID-19 Bed Use Projection









Updates on Service Delivery Models

- Senior Services:
 - Congregate dining, To Go meals, on-site classes. Virtual programming and wellness checks continue.
- Library Operations:
 - These services will continue as currently being delivered
- Behavioral Health and Developmental Disability Services:
 - Mental Health Services will continue in person services
 - Developmental Disabilities in person services, transportation, meals
- Administrative Services:
 - Encourage the utilization of teleworking when possible
- Tax Commissioner Offices:
 - All Locations Open

Protocol Update:

Facilities:

• Implemented mask policy that strongly encourages use of masks by visitors and employees except in tax offices, jail and clinical settings which are still required.

Courts:

- Continue to require masks and eliminates social distancing requirements.
- Continued use of virtual for jury selections.

Elections:

- Voters can't be required to wear a mask.
- If a voter requests a mask, one can be made available.
- Mask will only be required at facilities that have that mandate.

Summer Youth Job Training Program

The Fulton County Board of Commissioners approved expenditure of \$500,000 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding for the Summer Youth Job Training Program. Funding will be awarded to community-based organizations working with Fulton County Youth disproportionately impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic and its economic consequences.

ARPA Summer Youth Job Training Program Funding Priorities:

- 1. Training/Job Development/Employment in strategic industries which leads to self-sufficiency.
- 2. Access to digital literacy/ training for middle skill jobs including "earn and learn" models which allow job seekers to meet basic needs while training to enter living wage jobs.
- 3. In-Demand Career Exploration and re-engagement with educational systems by opportunity youth.
- 4. Wraparound Support to address basic needs during training.



Summer Youth Job Training Program Highlights:

- ➤The County will allocate funds to eligible, non-profit 501(c)3 community-based organizations located in Fulton County and submitting successful proposals.
- ➤Applicants must have successful track record implementing summer youth job training programs as demonstrated by a history of a minimum of 2 years providing career exploration, job opportunities, or improving educational or employment outcomes for Fulton County youth.
- ≻Funding must be used to support Fulton County Youth 16-24.
- ➤The minimum stipend must be no less than \$15/Hour for a minimum of 100 hours during the contract period, which concludes August 31, 2022.
- ➢Programs and services targeting "high risk" area(s) within Fulton County will receive priority points.

Since the beginning of COVID-19, the Fulton County Court System has amassed a significant and unprecedented level of cases. Project ORCA will address this challenge by utilizing a combination of capacity expansion and productivity enhancement initiatives to expedite the case adjudication process.




CASE DISPOSITION PROGRESS DISPOSITION STATUS BY OFFICE




