A RESOLUTION PROHIBITING TEMPORARY WORKERS FROM ACCESSING PERSONALLY INDENTIFIABLE INFORMATION MAINTAINED BY FULTON COUNTY; REQUIRING THOSE TEMPORARY WORKERS WHOSE DUTIES ABSOLUTELY REQUIRE THEM TO HAVE ACCESS TO SUCH INFORMATION TO RECEIVE CYBER SECURITY TRAINING AND TRAINING RELATED TO THE HANDLING OF PERSONALLY INDENTIFIABILE INFORMATION MAINTAINED BY THE COUNTY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

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10 Georgia, existing as such under and by the Constitution, statutes, and laws of the State;

WHEREAS, Fulton County, Georgia is a political subdivision of the State of

11 and

WHEREAS, pursuant to O.C.G.A § 10-1-911(6), personal information under Georgia law, which in some contexts is also known as Personally Identifiable Information ("PII"), consists of an individual's first name or first initial and last name, combined with other identifying information including their social security number, and driver's license or state identification number with at least one piece of such information being unencrypted; and

18 **WHEREAS,** the Board of Commissioners recognizes that unauthorized access 19 to PII maintained by the County exposes the individuals whose PII is improperly 20 accessed to injury and the County to potential liability and damages; and

WHEREAS, Fulton County Policy 600-60, Information Technology-Acceptable
Use Policy generally addresses Information Security, including the handling of PII; and
WHEREAS, while Fulton County Policy 600-60 applies to all those who work for
the County, whether permanent or contract employees or temporary workers, the Board
of Commissioners is concerned that the policy does not adequately address the unique
risks posed by temporary workers having access to PII maintained by the County; and
WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners believes that temporary workers

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utilized by the County should generally be prohibited from having any access to the PII
maintained by the County; and

30 WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners recognizes, however, that there may 31 be times where a temporary worker requires access to PII to perform the tasks assigned 32 to the temporary worker; and

WHEREAS, despite the occasional need for a temporary worker to have access to the PII maintained by the County, the Board of Commissioners believes that before a temporary worker is permitted to engage in work that requires the handling of any PII maintained by the County, the temporary worker must receive cyber security training to include training on the County's information technology policies, procedures and practices before engaging in work that requires the handling of any PII maintained by the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that temporary workers used by the
County shall not have access to Personally Identifiable Information maintained by the
County unless absolutely necessary to perform their duties.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the County Manager or his designee is directed to develop a training program for temporary workers utilized by the County regarding access to and the handling of Personally Identifiable Information maintained by the County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that if Fulton County deems it absolutely necessary for a temporary worker to have access to personal information, the temporary worker shall undergo training specifically tailored to the handling and usage of Personally Identifiable Information.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,	that the County Manager or his designee is
directed to review all County policies	related to sensitive, confidential information,
maintained by the County including, but	not limited to Personally Identifiable Information,
and to revise the same to reflect the co	ntents of this resolution.
BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, th	at this Resolution shall become effective when
adopted, and that all resolutions in con	flict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to
the extent of the conflict.
