A RESOLUTION BY THE FULTON COUNTY BOARD OF 1 2 COMMISSIONERS IN OBSERVANCE OF THE 94th 3 BIRTHDAY OF THE REVEREND DR. MARTIN LUTHER 4 KING JR. 5 6 WHEREAS, the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. ("Dr. King") was born in Fulton County, in the City of Atlanta, 94 years ago, on January 15, 1929, the son of Martin Luther King Sr. and Mrs. 7 Alberta Williams King, and the grandson of the Reverend and Mrs. A.D. Williams; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, Dr. King lies at eternal rest and peace alongside his wife Coretta Scott King, at The King Center for Nonviolent Social Change, on Auburn Avenue in Atlanta; and 11 12 WHEREAS, like his father and grandfather before him, Dr. King became the pastor of Ebenezer 13 Baptist Church in Atlanta; and 14 15 WHEREAS, Dr. King attended Booker T. Washington High School, then attended Morehouse 16 17 College and graduating at 19, then later earning a divinity degree in Pennsylvania and a Doctorof Philosophy Degree at Boston University; and 18 19 20 WHEREAS, in the early 1950s, King became the pastor of Dexter Avenue Baptist Church in Montgomery, Alabama and subsequently led many of the greatest nonviolent demonstrations in 21 United States history, including the Montgomery Bus Boycott; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, in 1957, only at the age of twenty-eight, Dr. King established the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) to fight segregation and achieve civil rights, and became its first 25 26 president; and 27 WHEREAS, in the face of crippling opposition, Dr. King stood firm and continued to fight for 28 29 social change, all while subjecting himself to danger and multiple arrests, including being arrested along with his brother Alfred Daniels "A.D." Williams King and dozens more participating in an 30 October 1960, Atlanta lunch-counter sit-in; and 31 32 33 WHEREAS, in August 1963, Dr. King delivered one of the world's most recognizable and 34 memorable speeches (I Have A Dream) to more than a quarter-million people in the United States 35 capital, on the National Mall in Washington, D.C., as the culmination of the historic March on Washington for Jobs and Freedom, which helped propel passage of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 36 37 and the Voting Rights Act of 1965; and 38 WHEREAS, in his last months of life, Dr. King was organizing the Poor People's Campaign, 39 traveling across the country to assemble a multiracial army of demonstrators representing those 40 who lived at and below the poverty line; and 41 42 WHEREAS, although Dr. King's life was tragically cut short at the age of 39 by an assassin at a 43 Memphis, Tennessee motel, while fighting for equality for city sanitation workers, his courage, 44 selflessness, and most importantly his philosophy of nonviolent direct action, caused a nation to 45 reevaluate its moral compass and paved the way for rational and nondestructive social change-a 46

47 struggle that by the very nature of the "Black Lives Matter" movement; and

1 2	WHEREAS, Dr. King's example continues to challenge us to meet the needs of the least of us, reminding us to be a voice for those silenced, courageous for those afraid, and to standup for

4 5 6 7	WHEREAS , at the age of thirty-five, Dr. King became the youngest recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize, and later was awarded posthumously the two highest American civilian honors: the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1977, and the Congressional Gold Medal in 2004; and	
8 9 10 11	WHEREAS , after a long and relentless effort by his Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity brothers, Dr. King's likeness stands as the only African-American at the United States National Mall in Washington, D.C., dedicated in 2011, at the Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial.	
12 13 14 15 16 17 18	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED , that on this fourth day of January in the year two thousand twenty-three, and of the establishment of Fulton County, Georgia over one hundred seventy years ago, the Board of Commissioners of Fulton County enthusiastically joins in the national observance of the 94th birthday of the Reverend Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., and hereby honors his life and legacy as the County's greatest resident, and urges all Fulton citizens to participate in the observance, and;	
19 20 21 22 23 24	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED , that the Board of Commissioners of Fulton County directs the Clerk to the Commission to spread this Resolution upon the official minutes and record of the Board of Commissioners of Fulton County, Georgia, and disseminate the Resolution appropriately throughout all of Fulton County and to the immediate family members of Dr. King.
