Rev. Langley interrupted his college studies to enlist in the United States Air Force, then returned to Atlanta and completed his education at Morris Brown College where he earned a degree in Religious Studies, followed by post graduate study at the Interdenominational Theological Center in Atlanta; and

Rev. Langley was employed for 38 years as a mail carrier with the U.S. Postal Service and was a Gold Member of the National Letter Carriers Association; and

Rev. Langly was a member of Big Bethel A.M.E. Church since the 1970's and was recognized as one of Big Bethel's Super Seniors for his lifelong dedication to the A.M.E. Church; he became an Associate Minister at Big Bethel and was active within several activities, including Men of Big Bethel, the *Heaven Bound* cast, Daughters and Sons of Bethel, Truth Seekers Sunday School Class, Willing Workers Pastor's Aid Board, Schofield Johnson Gospel Choir, and Vacation Bible School; and

on December 13, 1969, Rev. Langley married his wife, Jacquelyn Ashe, and they were blessed with two beautiful daughters, Gwendolyn and Keshia, and he was a proud grandfather of two granddaughters, Jalyn Buster and Dominique Langley, and two grandsons, Jamal Buster and David Langley; and

Rev. Langley was a humble and unassuming clergy leader who spent decades serving the sick and shut in of Atlanta, visiting countless homes, praying for healing; his tireless commitment to others revealed an unshakable compassion which strengthen our community by delivering hope on a



regular basis to those who needed it most;
