RESOLUTION BY THE FULTON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS IN OBSERVANCE OF PATRIOT DAY AND NATIONAL DAY OF SERVICE IN REMEMBRANCE OF SOULS LOST IN THE 2001, 9/11 TERRORIST ATTACKS ON AMERICA; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS on September 11, 2001, a group of small and hateful minds, terrorists hijacked four civilian aircraft, crashing two of them into the towers of the World Trade Center in New York City, a third into the Pentagon outside just outside Washington, D.C., and the fourth crashed in southwestern Pennsylvania after passengers tried to take control of the aircraft in order to prevent the hijackers from crashing the aircraft into an important symbol of democracy and freedom; and

WHEREAS these terrorist attacks were by far the deadliest ever launched against the United States, killing thousands of people; and conspired to threaten the very fiber of our country, seeking to break the American spirit and destroy our way of life; and

WHEREAS twenty years later, we pay tribute to the loss of those souls, reflect on treasured memories of those we lost, and resolve to never forget that day, even as we look toward a brighter and more hopeful future; and

WHEREAS we draw inspiration from the survivors who still bear the scars—both seen and unseen—of that tragic day, as we honor the valor of first responders, whose instinct was not to find safety for themselves, but to run toward untold danger; and

WHEREAS we show our gratitude to those young Fulton County residents and other Americans of the 9/11 Generation, who until that day lived knowing only peace, but who have answered our country's call to serve under the American flag to meet the threats of our present day with bravery and distinction; and

WHEREAS since 9/11, the people of Fulton County have joined Americans and others around the world demonstrating that in times of hardship and hurt, the values that define us do not simply endure—they grow stronger than ever through collective support. comradeship, prayers and service to each other.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Fulton County Board of Commissioners, on behalf of the more than one million people who call live and work in Fulton County, remembers and pays tribute to the selfless heroes and innocent victims of September 11, 2001; and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that twenty years after the fact, Fulton County again reaffirms the true spirit of patriotism, service, and unity that Fulton citizens felt in the days and months that followed the 9/11 attacks; and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED that this year, Fulton County hereby observes September 11, 2021, as Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance, as enacted by the U.S. Congress, and in accordance with that observance, all Fulton County buildings shall display the flag of the United States at half-staff in honor of the individuals who lost their lives on September 11, 2001; and

2	participate in the day of service by volunteering time, skills and working together to enrich
3	communities across Fulton County, and to observe this day with appropriate ceremonies
4	and activities, including remembrance services, and to observe a moment of silence
