

# 2020 Census Summary Results

- National: U.S. Population increased by 7.4% to 331.4 million residents—up from 308.7 million residents.
- State: 2020 Census results data show Georgia grew by 10.6 % to 10,711,908, an increase of 1,024,255 residents.
- **11-County Region**: The Atlanta Region's population exceeded 5 million residents (5,026,704).
- **County**: Fulton County grew by 15.9% from 920,581 to 1,066,710 (an increase of 146, 129).

## County Population Gain/Loss Map





## 2020 Census: Fulton County Results


### **2020 Census Local Level Results:**

- Since 2010, Fulton County grew by 15.9% from 920,581 to 1,066,710 (an increase of 146, 129).
- With a population of 1,066,710, Fulton County affords Georgia \$2.4 billion in federal funding.
- Fulton County's population resides in approximately 494,006 available housing units.

The Census data also highlighted key demographic data including:

- 79% of Fulton County is of voting age, representing 847,182 residents over age 18
- 42.5% of Fulton County's population is Black
- 39.3% of Fulton County's population is White (non-Hispanic)
- 8.7% of Fulton County's population is Asian
- 8.1% of Fulton County's population is Hispanic/Latino
- 7.4% of Fulton County's population is another race, including Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander
- 1.4% of Fulton County's population is American Indian or Native Alaskan

### Special Legislative Session (Begins November 3, 2021)

**Georgia – Redistricting is a Legislative Process** 

### Statewide:

- Congressional Districts: 14 (Avg. 765,136 residents)
- State Senate Districts: 56 (Avg. 191,284 residents)
- State House Districts: 180 (Avg. 59,510 residents
- Public Service Commission Districts: 5

### **Local Maps**


- County Commissions: 159 (size varies by county population distribution & equalization)
- Boards of Education: 180 public school districts
- Independent City School Boards: 21


Note: City Councils can redistrict under Home Rule or under the State of Georgia's legislative process.



# Fulton County Commission Districts

- 2020 Population: 1,066,710
- Districts 3 & 6 Had Fastest Growth
- Districts 1 & 5 Had Slowest Growth
- New Ideal Average District: 177,785







## Proposed Fulton County Redistricting Timeline

- Sept. 2021 Begin meeting with each Commissioner's office to review impact to your district and discuss possible redistricting scenarios. Create scenario maps for possible updated district lines for each district & seek input on these scenarios.
- Sept 2021 Request a legislative sponsor to authorize the OLCR to work with the Fulton County Board of Commissioners on 2021-22 Legislative Redistricting Maps.
- Oct 2021 Draw Map Drafts
- Oct 2021 Hold Public Hearing(s) on Map Drafts
- Nov 2021 Submit Map for Technical Review/Certification (Approx. 3-Day Process)
- Nov 2021 BOC Approves Maps and Resolution
- Nov 2021 Draft State Legislation with Map Legal Description
- Mid-Nov/Dec 2021 Advertise Local Map Legislation
- Jan 2022 Introduce Redistricting Legislation in GA General Assembly

## **Final Notes**

- Maps become official upon passage by the General Assembly and signature by the Governor.
  - NOTE: If Congress reinstates a formula and preclearance is required, maps would not be final until then.
- Members of each county's legislative delegation in the General Assembly have the authority to draft their own versions of local district maps.
