Scope of Work: The LIHWAP is currently managed within Fulton County by the Fulton Atlanta Community Action Authority (FACAA), in which Atlanta residents currently can enroll and receive financial assistance to pay water and sewer bills. Board approval would expand the program to eligible Fulton County water and sewer customers. Online enrollment, eligibility verification, and program management is facilitated by FACAA, and would require minimal support from Fulton County Water and Sewer billing division. Program requirements are contained on FACAA's website and includes eligible income levels based on number of persons in the household and other required documentation for the program. No cost would be incurred by the County but would provide both necessary financial assistance to program participants as well as additional revenues to the County's Water and Sewerage system.

Community Impact: Would allow eligible residents to continue to take advantage of the State of Georgia program for water bill assistance
